With fleece revenue being essential for many alpaca owners, we need to understand and respond to this issue..

This month we report on the AANZ AGM held in Christchurch, including the workshop that followed, where attendees and the national committee discussed the overall alpaca industry and its future.

New Zealand has found itself in the position of having a multi-tier alpaca industry. With over 90% of our readers being non-members of the alpaca association, we're in the fortunate position that we can reach many alpaca owners across all tiers. And with the support of the Alpaca Association, we are looking into how we can all benefit from a healthier, more sustainable alpaca industry that serves and benefits us all.

The National Council all arrived at Christchurch on the Friday to help with the setup at Russley Golf Course and stayed at the Airport Gateway Motor Lodge. Very nice rooms for a very reasonable price.

We all got together for tea at Joe's Garage and discussion on the various topics that we knew were to be brought up the next day.

A National Council meeting was held before the AGM lasting 1 & half hours. The AGM lasted nearly 2 hours and a new National Council was welcomed in.

Bob Phillips (AANZ president) also attended to update us on some of the things that the AANZ National Committee are working hard on. Over the past twelve months the NC has updated the registry, and run workshops on how to use it. Working with ABRI as they add new sections to the new registry that is already being used and transferring or linking sections from the old registry.

The old Alpaca Website is close to crashing and we urgently need a more user friendly modern website. Jakki, Cheryl W and Lesley have been looking at various platforms and we hope to have a new AANZ website in the near future.

There are four remits submitted to the AGM concerning Tb testing, the first remit is about abolishing Tb testing altogether, the second is an amendment to rule D3. The third is a modification of the Tb rule extending the time between Tb testing and the fourth is also amending rule D3.

There was discussion about the Judge Levy which is a user pays system to help support the training and retaining of judges in New Zealand.

Ideas about how to grow and promote the Region and AANZ in general were talked about, a series of how to promote, to sell, to get micron tested, etc.
